Jo Harris retired at the end of 2012 after 34+ years working for the YMCA. Jo started her career in Dallas in 1978 then worked at the Detroit Y for 9 years returning to Dallas in 1987. Jo held several positions during her YMCA career, starting out as a non-exempt administrative assistant and worked her way up to becoming Vice President-Operations before accepting a position with the YMCA of the USA.

Prior to stumbling into the Y, Jo taught elementary music in the El Dorado, Arkansas school district. Jo holds a Masters of Human Resources and Training from Amber (now Amberton) University in Garland, TX and Bachelor of Music Education from Ouachita Baptist University in Arkansas.
