Transportation

Traveling by Car:

- We can't wait to meet you and your camper! By car, camp is about 2 hours west of Dallas, 1.5 hours east of Abilene, and 1.5 hours south of Wichita Falls.

- Please leave ALL pets at home!

Drop Off:

- Drop off will be assigned by time. These assigned time are on the following page (pg7).
- The check-in process will take place as you drive through camp. There will be a welcoming committee to direct you to the cabin!
- Parents are welcome to stay and help their campers unpack.

- Pick up have assigned times.
 This will be communicated with you by email prior to arrival.
- There will be a welcoming crew assisting you with the check-out process. Please make sure to have a copy of your photo ID when you arrive. We can't release your camper to you without a photo ID.

Opening and Closing Day

Check-In day is an exciting time for campers and staff. The day is a well worked routine and we would like for your to know what to expect before arrival!

Stop 1:

You will drive down the hill to the first tent, you will be greeted by our staff and here you can drop off your camper's mail, credit card form, and packages for the week. Health History form and medications.

Stop 2:

You will next stop across from barn and drop off all medical forms and medication.

Stop 3:

The next stop will be at the Main Camp Office. Here you will receive your camper's cabin assignment.

Stop 4:

When you arrive at your cabin, your camper will have a lice check done.

Opening and Closing Day

- Pick at camp will be during scheduled times. Each parent will be informed by email what time to arrive to pick up their child.
- All campers will be picked up at the cabins they were dropped off. Parents will have their ID checked and will sign out their camper with the cabin staff.
- All luggage and belongings will be loaded into the car by staff so parents will not need to leave their vehicle at any point during the check out process.
- All store accounts will close with in 7 days of the campers last camp session.

Health Information

Bringing Medications to Camp

Campers are not allowed to keep ANY medication in their cabin. Medications brought to camp will be stored and administered in the Clinic. Please bring all medication pre-seperated and labeled by day and time taken. This will help minimize who will contact the medication. Medication will be collected at the cabins during check-in, and returned at the cabin during check-out.

- RX Medications: The medication must be in the original packaging with pharmacy label for dosing instructions with the camper's name. Our Camp Staff CANNOT accept or administer any medications that are not properly labeled as this violates the law. This includes pills, liquids, inhalers and injectables.
- OTC Medications: Campers who take over the counter meds for occasional symptomatic relief NEED TO BRING these medications with them to camp. OTC medication should also be brought to camp in its original packaging and dropped off at The Clinic table on Opening Day.
- Asthma Inhalers: Will be kept in the Clinic unless we have a doctor's note requesting that the camper carry it. This minimizes the risk of loss and allows Camp Staff to keep track of camper usage and take the necessary steps to improve respiratory health if the camper uses an inhaler more than usual.
- **Epi Pens:** Please check the expiration date prior to arriving at camp. Epi Pens are kept in the Clinic unless a doctor requests that the camper carries it.

IMPORTANT

Camp is not the time to experiment with new medications or the time to put your camper on a "medication vacation". This is especially true for campers with ADD/ADHD. We have found that because of the structured camp schedule these campers have a better experience if they stay on their medication while at camp.

Safety

At Camp Grady Spruce, our goal is for every parent and guardian to be able to walk onto our property and drop off your campers with no fear. Facilities and policies have been constructed to provide a thorough and consistent safe environment. To make sure you know that your camper is in safe hands here are few fast facts that will help ease your mind!

American Camp Association Accredited

Camp Grady Spruce is accredited by The American Camp Association (ACA). The ACA Accreditation covers over 300 standards in areas such as staff selection, safety rules, programs, health & sanitation and administration. This accreditation is voluntary, and we hope that it assures you that we are committed to a safe, nurturing environment for your children. Ratios

We have an overall staff-to-camper ratio of 1 to 8. Your camper's cabin will have at least two staff members at all times.

Camp Grady Spruce Staff

We carefully select the men and women of our staff because we expect them to be the best role models for your campers. Each staff member attends an intense 2-week orientation where they are extensively trained on counseling skills, safety procedures, child abuse, first aid/CPR, and activity skills. Staff forms a strong, committed team with a single focus: A safe summer filled with fun, learning, and growth opportunities for each camper.

Water Activities and Life Jackets

Camp Grady Spruce is known for its awesome waterfront! Due to the large number of activities that take place on Possum Kingdom Lake, we pride ourselves on our waterfront safety measures. All waterfront activities are supervised by YMCA Certified Lifeguards. These lifeguards participate in weekly training and drills so that their safety skills are always sharp throughout summer. In addition, because our waterfront is on a lake, it is YMCA policy that every camper wears a life jacket when they are in the water. If you have any concerns about your camper and the waterfront, please give us a call.



Cabin Assignments and Cabin Mate Requests

Camp Grady Spruce assigns cabins based on grade and age. We encourage campers to attend camp without cabin mate requests. It is our experience that cabin placement has little to do with your camper's success at camp. If you would like to make a request please follow the following guidelines and understand that while we will do everything in our power to accommodate requests, we do not guarantee that requests will be honored.

Cabin Mate Requests:

We divide cabin requests into two categories- YOU MUST USE the requests section during online registration – please do not call or email your request. The requests must be submitted more than 2 weeks prior to the start of your camp session. After that time, no changes are allowed. All placements are revealed on Opening Day and are final

Mutual: Both campers request each other AND are in the same grade OR are the same age. If campers in different grades mutually request each other, the older camper will be put in a younger cabin. Please keep in mind your camper may be with an entire cabin of younger campers if you make a mutual request.

Anti-Request: (USE CAREFULLY) – THIS IS HONORED BEFORE ANY OTHER CABIN-MATE REQUEST. If you DO NOT think it is best that your camper be placed with a particular camper we will make sure that the campers aren't placed together. While we will not share this information freely, there may be circumstances where it is necessary to reveal this information to address cabin placement questions.

Keeping Up With Your Camper

Though you won't be able to call or visit your campers during their stay, we DO have a few amazing options to stay in touch with your child while at camp.

Campers LOVE mail!

It takes time, but a handwritten letter from Mom, Dad, Grandma, Grandpa, etc. can make all the difference in the world! Here are some tips to make corresponding with your child more successful.

Helpful Tips:

1. ADDRESS LETTERS with your camper's name & cabin number (as soon as you know it).

- 2. Mail your first letter BEFORE CAMP STARTS. This ensures that your letter will reach camp for your camper's session. You can also drop off letters on Opening Day, please make sure to mark which day you would like your letter's to be delivered!
- 4. KEEP LETTERS POSITIVE! Don't focus on what your campers are missing at home; focus on how much fun they must be having! Letter's and emails from Bunk 1 are NOT the place to share sad news. Save that news for when they see you again!
 - 5. Provide your camper with pre-addressed/stamped envelopes to send mail home!

Keeping Up With Your Camper

Camp Grady Spruce uses **Bunk1** to keep parent's and campers in touch! Parents can view photos of camper's day-to-day activities, and even send camper's Bunk Notes (e-mails).

On Monday, after you have dropped off your camper you will get an email with the access code for Bunk1, once you have this please visit www.Bunk1.com to register for an account. Every night, Camp Staff uploads photos to Bunk1 from that day. Internet at camp is slow to say the least, so please be patient with photos being uploaded, the best time to check for photos is in the morning!

We make every effort to include each child on Bunk1 at least twice a week. If you have a camera-shy camper, call us and we'll make a special effort to find him/her with the camera.

Bunk Notes can be purchased in a minimum packet of five. Camp staff will print off Bunk Notes each day and deliver them at Mail Time.

Camper Behavior Policy

Please go over the following section with your camper so that they are aware of the standards they will be held to while at camp.

Admission as a Camp Grady Spruce camper carries many privileges and responsibilities. We expect campers to participate in the total life of camp and to co-exist in a cooperative spirit. Camp Grady Spruce reserves the right to warn, suspend or dismiss any program participant from our programs and facilities without a refund. The following are all grounds for dismissal:

- 1. Camper who is found with tobacco, alcohol, illegal drugs, or weapons on property
- 2. Should a behavior or discipline problem affect our work with other campers, or their enjoyment of Camp Grady Spruce, and we have exhausted all options.
- 3. Camper's behavior poses a threat to self or others.
- 4. Camper's behavior is determined to be inappropriate within the scope and spirit of YMCA values and the mission statement.

Camp Food Services

Three hearty and well-balanced meals are served each day. Each meal has fresh fruit, and a salad bar is available for lunch and dinner time meals. Cabins sit together and eat as a cabin group.

If your camper has special food needs or concerns including food allergies (i.e. gluten, lactose intolerance, etc.) or preferences (i.e. vegetarian), please complete the online medical form so that we can accommodate your needs.

Camp Grady Spruce is peanut free during summer camp. We do offer a peanut butter alternative called Sun Butter for Sun Butter and Jelly Sandwiches!

Birthdays at Camp

Camp is an incredible place to celebrate your birthday! We will make sure that it is an unforgettable day. We do provide a birthday dessert to each camper for their birthday. If you would like to send a "Birthday Party in a Box" (i.e. balloons, decorations, party hats, etc.), please give this to the mail table on opening day (not your camper's counselor).
